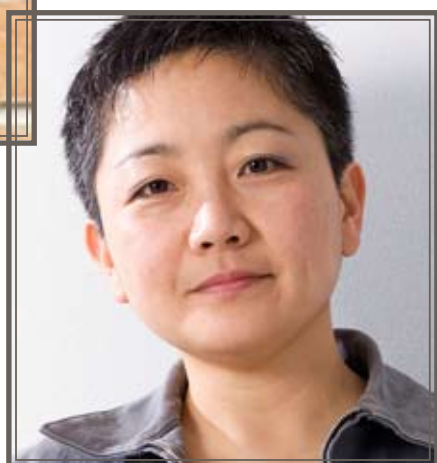

Thomas Trofimuk

Thomas Trofimuk is a Canadian writer of poetry and fiction. He's published in literary magazines across the country, and on CBC radio. His first novel, *The 52nd Poem* won the George Bugnet Novel of the Year Award and the City of Edmonton Book Prize at the 2003 Alberta Book Awards. His second novel, the critically acclaimed *Doubting Yourself to the Bone*, was named as one of the *Globe and Mail's* top 100 must-read books for 2006. His third book, *Waiting for Columbus*, was released in August 2009 in the US and Canada, and will be published in the UK, Serbia, Poland and Brazil in 2010. Thomas writes on a regular basis for his own website; "writer, gardener, failed Buddhist" at www.thomastrofimuk.com. He lives (and writes) in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada with his wife and daughter, and a small annoying black cat.

Chris Craddock

Chris graduated from the University of Alberta's BFA Acting Program in the spring of 1996. Chris is an Edmonton based Actor/Producer/Writer. His theatre work in Canada has been recognized with four Sterling Awards and two Dora Mavor Moore Awards, and his film *Turnbuckle* was nominated for two Ampia Awards. He is the proud recipient of the Embridge Emerging Artist award, the Centennial Medal for his contribution to the Arts in Alberta, and the Alberta Book Award for his collection of plays for teens *Naked at School*. His musical *BASH'd* (co-written and performed with Nathan Cuckow) received a 2007 GLAAD media award. Chris graduated from the University of Alberta's BFA Acting Program in the spring of 1996 and since then he has worked on stages all across Canada. He is the Edmonton Public Library's Writer in Residence for 2010.
